

Honoring ERNESTINE

Ernestine Tanner was born on March 14, 1931, in Hazlehurst, Mississippi. She was the second of eight children born to Ernest (Gus) Redmond and Alberta Redmond. She was preceded in death by her beloved grandson, William Gerald Tanner, Jr.; brothers, Ernest Redmond Jr. and Louis Redmond, sisters, Rosie Bell Redmond, Nellie Faye Banks, Hilda Jean Beacham, Mary Emma Workins and one God sister, Arlene Jackson.

Errestine received her early education at Damascus Elementary School in the Copiah County School System and later attended Hazlehurst City School. In Our Hearts


We thought of you today.
